Health and welfare inquiries INTO a disaster area will now have a precedence designator of "Q". (Was P2) Those comming OUT will continue to carry "P" for priority.

Inquiries re friends and relatives INTO a disaster area should be referred to the Red Cross or other agency. The originating amateur op can offer his services to the welfare agency and handle many such messages as "book" msgs. The ARRL numbered radiogram text "ARL Nineteen" can be used. And MOST IMPORTANT such "book" message can be addressed from one Welfare agency to another in the disaster area.

This appears most business-like. Receiving station need not locate every addressee and need only deliver the "book" to the Red Cross. Other more important business can be taken care of, and if needed a priority message in "book" form can be sent using "ARL Three, ARL Four or ARL Six" .

Thanks for the tip Hal. We must all prepare.



The President shall preside at all regular and special meetings of the club with the assistance of the other officers. He shall appoint committees and designate committee chairman of each committee. ARTICLE VIII MEETINGS MENLO PARK C-D CLUB Cont'd

month on which all meetings are to be held.

Special business meetings of the club may be called at the discretion of the President, upon notice setting forth the business to be transacted.

The meeting held during the last month preceding the end of the fiscal year shall be designated as the annual business meeting.

ARTICLE IX CHANGE IN BY-LAWS

A proposal may be submitted at any business meeting of the club, to make additions, cancellations, or amendments to these by-laws. Such proposals shall be discussed at that meeting and then tabled until the next business meeting of the club, when it shall be voted upon. To be adopted it must be passed by a majority of the qualified voters.

END

The MENLO PARK C-D CLUB is an integral part of the RADIO AMATLUR CIVIL EMERGENCY SERVICE (RACES). The Club Radio Station call is K6YQT. RACES is controlled by Civil Defense, an agency of government at various levels. The local C-D Director appoints a RACES Radio Officer, upon recommendation of the local C-D Radio Club, who must be holder of an amateur license. The RO must be certified to FCC by the C-D Director.

FCC does not issue operator licenses or authorizations for RACES. This is done at the local level by the C-D Director, upon recommendation of the Radio Officer. Thus the Civil Defense Director issues "certifications" to those enrolled in local C-D whose FCC operator licenses make them elligible to operate in RACES.

The safety and welfare of the population in the event of the ultimate disaster is the purpose and aim of RACES.

-Meter Project

The bugs are still chirping in my IF - Squelch - Detectors p.c. coard. I'm getting started rebuilding a new version with the IF and other components separated out on different p.c. board pieces so as to prevent intercoupling. The synchronous AM detector was giving the most trouble a red I will try isolating it by shiel ding with small vertical pieces of .c. board . Oh well, I'm slowly learning how hard radio design really is:

There is a new pair of IC's for AM and FM detection by RCA, descibed in OCTOBER QST. These are the CA3088 and 3089, and the latter real-y sounds exciting. It may be a life-saver for this project, as it has he following features: IF amp and limiter(10 V sensitivity), AGC feed-ack from its own signal level sensing, muting (squelch) built in and ontrollable by an external pot, FM quadrature detector requiring only single external tuned circuit, and an AF preamp putting out half a volt audio. What more do you expect from one chip?:

I'm planning to build up an IF strip using theses two new IC's soon as I receive the free samples RCA is sending me. Meanwhile I'm till trying to get my old p.l.l. IF strip to play right. Haven't had tie to get back to the transmitter bord which I never finished alligning he coils on.

tereo Decoders on One IC Chip

The OCTOBER POPULAR ELECTRONICS issue has an article on a new IC y RCA, the CA 3090Q, which has a complete stereo decoder on one chip. 11 you have to do to convert any FM radioi to stereo is connect a single uned circuit and the input and two outputs, and 12 V. dc. Actually, the rticle talks about the SK3078 IC but I just got a data sheet on the 3090 hich is the same thing as far as I can tell.

Motorolla just came out with something even more interesting: their MC1310, which doesn't need any tuned circuit because it's built around a phase lock loop. I don't know any more about it yet, but it's another one-IC stereo decoder to try.

requency Synthesizer for the DRAKE R4

Bob Stein, W6NBI, who built us a nice tunable prototype converter for our 2-meter project, has just completed another successful design.

He designed and built a phase locking local oscillator for the R4 so he wouldn't need any crystals (except one, for reference) in switching bands In fact, he has full coverage with it, as all he's got to do is peak up the preselector on any frequency listened to. The p.l.l. used is partly the Motorolla p.l.l. and a homebrew VCO made with a varactor. He tried at first using the Signetics NE562 but it resulted in too much modulation of the VCO output by the reference signal. Anybody that wants to copy Bob's design call him at 968-1677(work) or 967-7559(home). He told me the cost would range around \$40 bucks, assuming you buy surplus parts toma large extent as he did.

OSCAR FLY-BY

I fired up the club's 4-65 linear on 2, using the club's Gonset for drive, and I screamed and hollered into that flown-by transponder, but as far as I know only one station in San Jose heard me come out on 10 meters. My own 10 m, receiver was lousy and I wasn't hearing anybody except Cliff, W6HDO talking to the pilot further down the band. Of course, Cliff had a KW \$ as compared with a watt or so out of the transponder, so no wonder I heard him. Ed, W6AIN tried listening for me om 10 but he did not hear much before it disappeared over the horizon,

How to Watch Blacked Out Games For Free on UHF TV


