

January 7 Meeting:

Predicting Propagation for DX

At the first PAARA meeting of 2005, **Dean Straw**, **N6BV**, ARRLs Senior Assistant Technical Editor, will speak about Strategies Using Propagation Predictions for DXing and Contesting. Straw will show how to use propagation software, local terrain models and antenna modeling tools to plan for specific DX contacts and to guide contest band strategies. One of the most interesting parts of the lecture will be his comparison of the predictions he compiled for the rare W6VU4 path several months ago, with the actual conditions during December 2004.

At our December 84 PAARA meeting, we had the good fortune of hearing all about the latest frontier in ham radio from Ted Harris, N6IIU. Some PAARA members were involved in the MEDEX simulated emergency exercise... Andy VE3FZK [now KR6DD]... at Kaiser Hospital... Redwood City... SPECS members ... at various hospitals and Red Cross locations further south... successful SET especially because of the support by packet radio units. At Kaiser Redwood City, we had Dick W6HPA and his son Alexander who just got his ham license, manning a packet station.
