



PAARA Members QSL almost 50 years later.



This photo depicts PAARA member Vic Black, AB6SO on the left and John Walther, K6PKT on the right at the most recent PAARA monthly meeting. John is displaying two QSL cards from K6IOW (Vic Black's call in the early 50's). And here they are again, at a PAARA meeting. Talk about a small world.

Vic Black was first licensed in 1954 as KN6IOW which was a one year, non-renewable novice class license. His mother was a friend of John Walther's mother who were neighbors. Young John Walther, who was three years younger than Vic, became interested in radio while he was involved with the Mountain View, Troop 23 Boy Scouts. As it happened, Vic was a general class operator by that time and had earned his Eagle rank with God and Country Award in the same troop. As Vic was helping the younger Scouts through the Stanford Area Council of the Boy Scouts or Explorer Scouting as it is called today, he ended up teaching morse code to young John Walther so he could qualify for the merit badge in radio. His interest increased and soon John was a short wave listener "SWL" and then he earned his novice license and first call sign of KN6PKT. The N was dropped by the FCC when the licensee earned a technician or general license. John up-graded and became an extra class 20 wpm radio operator. John served in the U.S. Navy as a radioman and went on to a career in high tech.

When John brought the two QSL cards to the PAARA meeting it came as a complete surprise to Vic. However, he confirmed that they were his old QSL cards, one for an SWL verification and the other for his first QSO as a novice licensee. Way to go John!! This is one of the fun parts of amateur radio. Thanks guys. See you on the air.


PAARA is soliciting donations of equipment for our annual Field Day emergency-


- Five or six roughly identical, reasonably rugged laptop computers, just fast enough to run Windows XP.

Donations are not tax deductible, but larger donations will garner you a company logo emblazoned on one or more of our trailers, tents, or other equipment.




N6NFI appointed new ASVARO rep for PAARA.

Gerry Tucker managed to sell items to boost the club finances in recent July fleamarket.


Picnic: Due to timely unavailability of a picnic site there will be NO PAARA picnic this year.






