




The demise of code (CW) has actually come to pass as noted elsewhere in this fine publication and in many other areas of the ham radio community. Many of us older, wiser radio operators who worked so hard for such a long time to learn and use the code are dismayed, in fact, we are shocked that the FCC would do away with this learning re-

quirement. Many Extra class radio operators felt that the Government would at least keep the code requirement for the Extra class license as it was just another way of making the license more difficult and much more worthwhile to earn and use. However, our Government leaders and those at the FCC. who must know more than we do, have elected to cancel the code requirement. This of course is a windfall for those licensed hams and many yet to be licensed radio operators, who will now take the necessary FCC tests through the Volunteer Examiner system to either up grade or earn their amateur radio operator licenses. Do I dare suggest that this is part of the 'dumbing down of America'? We shall see what happens as time goes along. For example, we have learned that many VE's have already submitted their resignations to the various VEC's that provide the testing service because they believe there is really no use in testing candidates any more as it has become ridiculously easy to pass the tests. We have also learned that some of the other VEC's have stepped up their testing services with new questions from the pool. I believe the thing to remember is that real hams use code and it should be a mode that does not disappear forever.

# ANOTHER EQUIPMENT DONATION TO PAARA.

PAARA member **Sister Jean, KG6UGO**, of Mission San Jose, made arrangements with an old friend by the name of **Ralph Long** to accept four old Motorola vehicle radios and what Ralph thought was an older repeater system. Sister Jean contacted her very best ham friend, **Stan Towle, WA6ZGI**, another PAARA member, to pick up the equipment from Ralph's home in Fremont.

So, on a recent Saturday afternoon, **Stan, WA6ZGI** and **Terry, AA6T**, traveled to Ralph Long's home to interview him and collect the equipment that was being donated to PAARA with no strings attached. We learned that Ralph was a non ham and had come into possession of the radios through an old business friend of his who had passed away years earlier. Ralph could not even remember what kind of business his friend had operated. Ralph Long is 76 years young and was rather proud of his 20 years experience in the U.S. Navy as an A3 aircrew maintenance member. He then worked for 23 years at the Oakland Airport for National Airmotive and has since been working part time as a funeral director and facilitator.

The radio equipment was transported across to the good side of the Bay and deposited at **Joel Wilhite's** QTH as he is the technical representative for PAARA. In fact, since this article was prepared, Joel has become the new vice president for PAARA. He concluded that the repeater was not a repeater, simply a two frequency radio system, with four radios designed for vehicles. The PAARA Donation committee will determine how these things will be disposed of in the future. Usually they are taken to the flea market for sale and any money collected goes into the PAARA general operating fund.

# 3900 Saturday Mornings.

The older that I get, the more I tend to enjoy Saturday mornings. Perhaps it's the quiet solitude that comes with being the first to rise, or maybe it's the unbounded joy of not having to be at work in the office. Either way, the first few hours of a Saturday morning are most enjoyable.

A few weeks ago, I was shuffling toward the radio shack with a steaming cup of coffee in one hand and my wireless telephone in the other. What began as a typical Saturday morning turned into one of those lessons that life seems to hand you from time to time. Let me tell you about it:

I turned up the dial into the phone portion of the band on my Icom 706 in order to listen to a Saturday morning swap net. Along the way, I came across an older sounding fellow, with a tremendous signal and a golden voice. You know the kind; he sounded like he should be in the broadcasting business or may have been a grizzled, old airline captain with the deep, gravelly voice. He was telling whom ever he was talking with something about "a thousand marbles." I was intrigued and stopped to listen to what he had to say.

"Well, Terry, it sure sounds like you're busy with your job. I'm sure that they pay you well but it's a shame you have to be away from home and your family so much. Hard to believe a young fellow should have to work sixty or seventy hours a week to make ends meet. It's too bad you missed your daughter's "dance recital", he continued. Let me tell you something that has helped me keep my own priorities." And that's when he began to explain his theory of a "thousand marbles."

"You see, I sat down one day and did a little arithmetic. The average person lives about seventy-five years. I know, some live more and some live less, but on the average, folks live about seventy-five years in this day and age."

"Now then, I multiplied 75 times 52 and I came up with 3900, which is the number of Saturdays that the average person has in their entire lifetime. Now, stick with me Terry, I'm getting to the important part. This is a 75 year old man, K9NZQ, clear and going QRT, good morning!".

You could have heard a pin drop on the band when this fellow signed off. I guess he gave us all a lot to think about. I had planned to work on the antenna that morning, and then I was going to meet with a few other hams to work on another radio club project. Instead, I went inside and woke my wife up with a kiss. "Come on honey, I'm taking you and the kids to breakfast." "Wow, what brought this on?", she asked with a smile. "Oh, nothing special, it's just been a long time since we spent a Saturday morning together with the kids. And, can we stop by at a toy store while we're out? I need to buy some marbles."

# K6URO presented with PAARA exemplary service award.




