President's corner

Spring has sprung and the recent warm weather motivates me to get out and start operating portable. My favorite setup can often be seen when I set up to my station at Am-Tech Day (<u>http://am-tech.info</u>), sponsored by the Foothills Amateur Radio Society. This once a month activity gives us an opportunity to set up and test our portable stations and provides amateurs who are new to our hobby a with chance to talk to experienced operators and get their advice.

When I operate portable, I use my Elecraft K2-100 powered by the largest sealed lead-acid battery I feel comfortable carrying (usually about 12 AH). The K2, while a bit bigger than some portable rigs, has some great redeeming features. It is relatively lightweight, has an unmatched receiver in a small package, is quite rugged, and has low receive current. The way I usually configure my K2, it draws approximately 380 mA on receive. In full QRP trim that can be shaved down to about 160 mA. Low receive current lets me carry smaller batteries or operate for a longer time.

The antenna I like best for portable operation is the Pacific Antenna PAC-12 (<u>http://www.pacificantenna.com</u>). This antenna weighs in at about 2 or 3 pounds and is quite compact and easy to set up. It is made from 1/4" aluminum round stock with loading coils wound on high grade PVC pipe. While the manufacturer produces a coil which can be adjusted to resonate the radiator throughout the HF bands, I prefer using a few coils which are tuned to key bands: 40m, 30m, 20m, 15m. This reduces losses from circulating currents in the shorted section of the adjustable coil. By adjusting the length of the telescoping whip on top of the coil I can adjust the antenna to cover HF bands from 40m through 10m while matching my transmitter well enough to avoid using a tuner.

For a portable antenna, ground losses are typically the biggest problem. This is why I carry the largest set of radials which I feel I can carry. A minimum number of radial wires for me is typically 13 and sometimes I use as many as 39. I see many people only using 4 radials for a shortened vertical and that setup throws away (heating the earthworms) much of the power which the transmitter is attempting to deliver to the 'ether'. That can easily make the difference between working a station and not.

With the warm weather returning and improved Spring propagation, I hope to hear you on the air signing /P soon!

March PAARA Board Meeting The meeting was held at the Palo Alto Red Cross in March 12, 2007, and was called to order at 7:13. Present were Terry Finn AA6T (past Pres.), Ron

Chester W6AZ (Treasurer), Wally Porter K6URO (PAARAgraphs Editor), Jole Wilhite KD6W (VP), Kristen McIntyre K6WX (Pres.), Rob Riley KG6HVW (Dir.) Rick Melrose K6RDM (database and dues), Gerry Tucker N6NV (Dir.), Vic Black AB6SO, Doug Teeter KG6LWE (Dir.), Elaine Gibbons WA6UBE (tours), John McCollum (Boy Scouts), Dave Frydenlund (Boy Scouts) and David Ungar W6DH (Sec.), who arrived a bit later. > (Thanks to Doug KG6LWE for taking notes till I arrived.)

The board took up old business: At the last meeting, attendance was excellent (80+). People who want to make announcements must arrive promptly at meetings. Future meetings' speakers were discussed. Joel Wilhite KD6W is working to set up a PAARA field trip to KNTV's transmitter in April and will coordinate with Elaine Gibbons WA6UBE. We next heard the Treasurer's report, which indicated that last month was good for our finances. A month ago, the board formed a new website committee, however the site remains out-of-date. The members of the committee who were present volunteered to check in to the situation. We next discussed membership cards, which will be printed and distributed. Elaine Gibbons WA6UBE then led a discussion of upcoming PAARA tours and events. The board decided to name this activity "PAARAtrips." Elaine Gibbons WA6UBE, tour and event coordinator, has tentative plans for some exciting tours, and is researching logistics. The tours will be announced in PAARAgraphs and at meetings as the plans firm up. Speaking of PAARAgraphs, members are encourages to contribute articles. PAARA's flea market is coming up on July 14, and volunteers are needed. As in other flea markets, Joel Wilhite KD6W and Doug Teeter KG6LWE will raise funds for the club by selling donated equipment. (Thanks!) The board also discussed the club's 70th anniversary, received a report from the Bylaws Committee, and took up the subject of the club's relationship with the Red Cross.

This is not a contest, a race, a competition. It is a Challenge. My challenge to all PAARA members is to get on the air and make QSOs. This could be a big challenge for those newly licensed, or those newly upgraded to hf privileges. To the old timers who have already worked all states before, it could seem like a "been there, done that." Fair enough, but that's where I will enco-courage you to consider how you could make it a challenge for yourself to work all states by 2/15/08.

Perhaps you could do it all on one band, or one mode, or using a particular rig, or a particular antenna. Does it seem too easy to work all states from your home QTH with the 70 ft tower and tribander? Well challenge yourself by doing it from portable locations, such as by the Bay in your car, driving down 101, or at Amtech Day. We all have ways to make it a challenge for ourselves. Do that. For example, my states reported on above were all worked with 1 watt or less power out, as that was a challenge for me. I worked Hawaii on SSB with 1 watt out on 20m (easy), 40m (harder), and 80m (a lot harder). I made my CA QSO by working Santa Cruz on cw with 16 milliwatts out.

I will be happy to endorse your Anniversary WAS Certificate with whatever particular challenge you made for yourself. For example: "This award was earned by working all stations on 40m & 80m only, using a restored 1960's boatanchor station, feeding a simple wire antenna up only 22 feet." Have some fun with this and improve your ham skills in the process. And inspire others to participate by doing so!

The Challenge is already getting great results. A new club Director was seen clambering around his Menlo Park roof, planning how to best rig a dipole to earn his WAS. Another new Director was spotted at a local burger joint, sketching his backyard on a napkin for an oldtimer, as they discussed how to best launch rf into the ether from his new Kenwood TS-820S. Yes!! Keep up the good work!

Over two years ago, the board formed a bylaws committee in order to revise the club bylaws. Palo Alto Amateur Radio Association Bylaws

As Amended January 8, 1999.

By-Laws for the regulation, except as otherwise provided by statute or its articles of incorporation of Palo Alto Amateur Radio Association, Inc.

Article I: Members

a. The members of this corporation shall be divided into two classifications, namely active members and associate members. An active member shall be any person holding a valid amateur radio operatorÕs license. All other members shall be associate members. All members shall have full voting privileges, but only active members may hold office.

b. Any prospective member may apply for membership at his/her first attended meeting. Applications for membership may be voted upon at their second attended meeting. A three fourthÕs majority of the members present shall be required to elect an applicant to membership.

c. Upon being elected to membership, the applicant shall pay dues at a rate set by the Board of Directors.

d. Upon election and payment of dues, the applicants name shall be inscribed in the membership book. All dues shall become payable on January 1 for the ensuing year, and members elected to membership during the course of a year shall make a pro rata payment for the balance of the year.

e. Any member who fails to pay dues for a period of three months shall, at the discretion of the Board of Directors, be dropped from the membership book of the corporation.

Article II: Corporate Powers

The corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors, all of whom shall be members of this corporation in good standing. Five members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article III: Board of Directors

The Board of Directors shall consist of the officers, four directors and the immediate past president.

Article IV: Powers of Directors Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at the call of the President or, in his/her absence, the Vice-President, on such notice as is determined

by the Board of Directors. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or Vice-President on twenty-four hoursÕ notice to each director, either personally, by mail or by telephone. The Directors shall have the power:

a. to set the dues rate;

b. the Directors shall consider and report at each meeting all proposals for the benefit of the individual members or the general welfare of the corporation;

c. the Board of Directors shall adopt ways and means for the advancement of the corporation, designate work to be done between meetings of the corporation,

audit all accounts for expenses, and direct the expenditure of funds of the corporation but not in excess of the amount held by the Treasurer.

d. to have general charge of all interests of the organization.

Article V: Duties of the Directors

It shall be the duty of the Directors to keep complete records of all their meetings and acts, and make reports to the general membership.

Article VI: Duties of the President

It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the corporation and to preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. The President shall prepare a budget at the beginning of his/her term and a financial report at the end of the term. The President shall request, on a regular basis, from the Treasurer, a list of income and expenses. It shall be the further duty of the President to appoint replacements of officers and directors not able to serve their term. Appointees shall serve until the next regularly scheduled election. Make all committee appointments.

Article VI: Duties of the Vice-President

It shall be the duty of the Vice-President to assist the President and to perform all the duties of the President during his/her absence.

Article VIII: Duties of Secretary

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to receive all communications that may be addressed to the club or that may be submitted by the other officers of the club and to keep a full report of the proceedings of each meeting. The Secretary shall read all communications upon request of the President. The Secretary shall maintain a book listing all members of the organization and shall perform such other duties as may be required by the club. The Secretary shall also promptly deliver up all books, paper, or other property of the corporation to his/her successor in office, or whomsoever the club may appoint.

Article IX: Duties of Treasurer

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all dues and moneys belonging to the club and pay all orders drawn by the Board of Directors and approved by the President.

Article X: Election of Officers and Term of Office

The President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected for a period of one year and two directors shall be elected for a period of two years at the annual meeting in November and to serve the next calendar year. In September of each year the president shall appoint three persons to serve as a nominating committee. The committee will select and interview a slate of nominees for officers and directors seats. The slate of nominees will be introduced at the October general meeting. Additional nominations will be accepted from the floor at this time, after which nominations will be closed. No person may be nominated without the nominees willing acceptance. The election will be held at the December regular meeting. The Secretary will report the election results as the last order of business. The nominating committee is disbanded at this time.

Article XI: Official Station Trustee

The Trustee of the club station license, call sign W6OTX, shall be a member in good standing. The Trustee shall be selected by the Board of Directors and serve an indefinite term. The Trustee shall have a valid operators license either Extra or Advanced Class and be responsible for the timely renewal and maintenance of the station license.

Article XII: Bylaw Amendment

The Bylaws of the corporation may be amended by a three-fourths vote of the membership in attendance after due notice as provided herein. Proposals for amendment shall be submitted in writing at a regular meeting of the corporation. Motion to amend the Bylaws of the corporation made at any regular meeting shall be mailed to each member at least fifteen days prior to the next regular meeting, at which time a vote will be taken. Votes of absentee members may be exercised by written proxy.

Article XIII: Order

In any question coming before a meeting for which no provision has been made in the articles of incorporation and by-laws, the officer presiding over the meeting shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

And here are the proposed bylaws:

BYLAWS of the

PALO ALTO AMATEUR RADIO ASSOCIATION, INC.

As amended in full on [date].

Bylaws for the regulation, except as otherwise provided by statute or the Articles of Incorporation, of the Palo Alto Amateur Radio Association, Inc.

ARTICLE 1.MEMBERS

A. The members of this Association shall be divided into two classifications, namely full members and associate members. A full member shall be required to hold a valid Amateur Radio operator's license. All other members shall be associate members. All members have full voting privileges, but only full members may hold an elected office.

B. Any prospective member may join the club at any time by completing a membership application and paying dues for the current year at the rate set by the Board of Directors.

C. Upon payment of the dues, the new member's contact information shall be entered into the membership database of the Association. All dues shall become payable on January 1 for the ensuing year, and members joining during the course of a year shall make a pro rata payment with a minimum of six months payment for the balance of the year.

D. Any member who fails to pay renewal dues for a new year by March 31 shall, at the discretion of the Board of Directors, be dropped from the active membership records of the Association.

E. The Board may, by majority vote, grant lifetime membership status to any member or past member of the Association who has warranted such recognition by extraordinary service and contributions to the Association over many years. Life Members are not required to pay dues any longer.

F. When necessary, the Board of Directors may establish fair and equitable procedures for considering the suspension or termination of the membership status of any member. Any such procedures must be clearly written and available to any member upon request. Suspension or termination can only be carried out after a finding that the member interfered with Association activities by engaging in conduct that was seriously prejudicial to the reputation, interests, or purposes of the Association.

ARTICLE 2.CORPORATE POWERS

The corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors, all of whom shall be full members of this Association in good standing. ARTICLE 3.BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A. The Board of Directors shall consist of four Officers, namely the President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer, plus four Directors. During the first year that a newly elected President serves, the immediate past President shall be invited to serve on the Board for one additional year, as a fifth Director, to assist the Board with his/her expertise and to help smooth the transition from one administration to the next.

B. Five members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business requiring a vote. All Officers and Directors shall have an equal vote on all such matters, with decisions made by a majority of those present.

C. All Officers and Directors serve without compensation, are expected to attend all Board meetings, and to assist with the club activities all year.

D. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at the call of the President or, in his/her absence, the Vice-President, on such notice as is determined by the Board of Directors. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or Vice-President on at least twenty-four hours' notice to each member of the Board, by at least two of the following means: in person, by amateur radio, by postal mail, by E-mail, or by telephone.

ARTICLE 4.POWERS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors shall:

(a) set the dues rate;

(b) consider all proposals for plans or actions to accomplish the purposes of the Association;

(c) adopt ways and means for the advancement of the Association and designate work to be done between meetings of the Board;

(d) have general charge of all interests of the Association;

(e) create and dissolve committees and other non-Board positions. The Board shall charge them with appropriate purposes and authorities, as needed for conducting Association activities and accomplishing the Association purposes;

(f) ratify, by majority vote, the members that the President is privileged to appoint to the committees and other non-Board positions that the Board has established;

(g) monitor all financial accounts, direct the expenditure of funds of the Association, but not in excess of the amount held by the Treasurer, and ensure the financial viability of the club.

ARTICLE 5.DUTIES OF THE DIRECTORS

It shall be the duty of the Directors:

(a) to provide leadership and direction to the Board and the club;

(b) to act according to the best interests of the Association and its purposes.

ARTICLE 6.DUTIES OF PRESIDENT

It shall be the duty of the President:

(a) to preside at all regular meetings of the Association and to preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors;

(b) to appoint replacements for Officers and Directors not able to serve their complete term, as well as to fill otherwise vacant positions on the Board. These appointments do not require the ratification of the Board, but such appointees shall only serve until the next regularly scheduled election;

(c) to appoint members to committees and other non-Board positions established by the Board, subject to the ratification by the Board.

ARTICLE 7.DUTIES OF VICE-PRESIDENT

It shall be the duty of the Vice-President:

(a) to assist the President;

(b) to perform all the duties of the President during his/her absence.

ARTICLE 8.DUTIES OF SECRETARY

It shall be the duty of the Secretary:

(a) to receive all communications that may be addressed to the club or that may be submitted by the other members of the club and to keep a full record of the proceedings of each meeting. The Secretary shall read all communications upon request of the President;

(b) to make reports of the Board meetings to the general membership;

(c) to keep the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Association and have the same with him/her at every meeting. He/she shall note all amendments, changes and additions to these documents and shall permit them to be consulted by members upon request;

(d) to take charge of the annual election process, including ensuring that the pre-election deadlines are met, that only members vote, that all votes are properly tabulated and results properly announced to the membership. The Secretary shall also keep track of all committee and special position appointments and ensure that they are accurately reported in the Association newsletter;

(e) to ensure that the membership roster is well-maintained at all times, and notify the Board whenever there is a possibility the Association will be disqualified from ARRL affiliation, or any other affiliations currently held;

(f) to promptly deliver up all books, papers, or other property of the Association to his/her successor in office. ARTICLE 9.DUTIES OF TREASURER

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer:

(a) to receive and bank all monies paid to the club including the responsibility for oversight of the collection of membership dues;

(b) to keep an accurate account of all monies received and expended;

(c) to pay all Association bills, but only with proper authorization, according to the procedures adopted by the Board of Directors;

(d) to submit financial statements to the Board of Directors, at its regular meeting after the end of each quarter, that accurately reflect the income and expenditures of the Association;

(e) to promptly deliver everything in his/her possession belonging to the Association to his/her successor in office.

ARTICLE 10.ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND TERMS OF OFFICE

A. The President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer shall be elected for a period of one year, to serve the next calendar year. In addition, two Directors shall be elected for two-year terms and two more Directors shall be elected for one-year terms. The Directors' terms shall be staggered, so that at each election one of the two-year terms will be expiring and one of the two-year terms will have one more year remaining. This staggering of terms means that at every election there will be three Director positions open for election: one for a two-year term and two for one-year terms.

B. In the event that a two-year term Director is unable to complete the first year of his/her term, that first year will be completed by an appointee, as specified in Article VI, and the next election shall choose a Director to serve the second year of that two-year term. This will ensure that the proper staggering of Director positions is maintained, as specified above.

C. During the one year that an immediate past President serves as the fifth Director, this position is held at the pleasure of the immediate past President, and is not part of the election process.

D. In September of each year the President shall appoint three persons to serve as a nominating committee. The committee shall interview and select a slate of nominees for Officer and vacating Director positions.

E. The slate of nominees shall be introduced at the October general meeting. Additional nominations shall be accepted from the floor at the October and November general meetings. No person may be nominated without the nominee's willing acceptance. At both of these meetings, any nominee that wishes shall be given an opportunity to solicit votes by communicating their qualifications and reasons for their running. Nominations shall be closed at the end of the November meeting.

F. The final slate of nominees shall be published in the December newsletter and the election shall be held at the December regular meeting by secret ballot. No quorum is defined or required for this election. Members must be present at the meeting to vote. Voting by proxy is not permitted. Each position on the ballot is filled by the nominee receiving the greatest number of votes for that position. Ties are resolved by a flip of the coin witnessed by the tied candidates, immediately after the ballots have been counted. The Secretary shall report the election results as the last order of business at the December meeting. The election process is then complete and the nominating committee is disbanded.

G. Any elected Officer or Director may be removed by a three-fourths vote of the general membership, said vote to be initiated by a majority vote of the Board. ARTICLE 11.OFFICIAL STATION TRUSTEES

The Trustees of the club station licenses shall be full members in good standing. The Trustees shall be selected by the Board of Directors and serve at the discretion of the Board. The Trustees shall have valid Extra Class licenses and shall be responsible for the timely renewal and maintenance of the station licenses, as well as the lawful operation of the stations.

ARTICLE 12.BYLAW AMENDMENT

The Bylaws of the corporation may be amended by the following sequential process:

(a) the amendment must be proposed at a Board meeting and endorsed by a majority vote of the Board;

(b) the Board-approved amendment shall be submitted in writing at a general meeting of the Association and published in the next monthly newsletter or otherwise mailed to each member at least fifteen days prior to the next general meeting;

(c) at the next general meeting a vote shall be taken by secret ballot. Members must be present to vote. Voting by proxy is not permitted. A three-fourths vote of the members in attendance is required for passage.

ARTICLE 13.NON-LIABILITY

The members, Officers, and Directors of the Association shall not be personally liable for the debts, liabilities, or other obligations of the Association or its corporation.

ARTICLE 14.ORDER

In any question coming before a meeting for which no provision has been made in the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws, the meeting shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

4) Confirmation of contacts will be with QSL card for each state and each contact. No Log of the World confirmations accepted. Cards will be checked by Rick, N6DQ.

5) In the spirit of the competition, all contacts should be made without the aid of electronic CW readers or programs. Since this cannot be monitored, the honor system is in place. In addition, "over the shoulder" help by a parent or another ham is not in the spirit of the contest and is not "cricket". Again, the honor system is in effect. 




