Days. He is being assisted by Ron, W6AZ, and our station captains: Andreas, N6NU, for CW, John, K6YP, for phone, Elaine, WA6UBE, for GOTA (Get On The Air), Joel, KD6W for VHF and above, and myself for a second CW station. Doug, KG6LWE, will be doing all of the back breaking work of wiring up all of the power and local communications as well as helping Gerry and his crew get the towers in the air. Former PAARA president Terry, AA6T, will be taking care of public information. Though he might be out of town for Field Day Terry has already taken care of many of the details. Robert, KG6UWZ, is making sure we have food for all who visit and Rick, K6RDM, will be supplying the operators with their food and refreshments. There are many others who are planning to help out in various ways that are too numerous to mention individually and I'd like to thank them all. It is really wonderful to have so many great volunteers to work with.

As I'm writing this, I'm nursing a pretty good sunburn which I got from both walking the Field Day site with the whole team and from mostly watching Gerry, N6NV, Doug, KG6LWE, Les, WY6H, and Peter, K6WEB, assemble our 40m 3 element beam (see page 76). We did this in the parking lot of Doug's shop in Menlo Park to see if the antenna was working properly. Last year, while using this antenna for CW, I noticed that the SWR was unstable and that the antenna did not seem to have much of a front-to-back ratio. After assembly we found an intermittent problem which caused the resonant frequency to shift 70 KHz, fixed it, and I verified that it does form a beam. Gerry has marked the antenna with paint for easy assembly on the big day. I understand that there is another group looking at one of the tri-banders today.

PAARA 70th ANNIVERSARY W6AZ WAS Challenge Update

As the first to complete WAS during the PAARA 70th Anniversary year, and having made at least five of his 50 qualifying QSO's on CW, *Dave Wolfe, AA6XV*, has earned the title of *W6AZ WAS Challenge Winner*. Dave will receive PAARA 70th Anniversary WAS Certificate #1, and his choice of the three prizes offered by W6AZ.

Dave's accomplishment was a multiband, multimode effort, completed in 86 days from the start of the challenge. In fact, 46 of Dave's 50 qualifying QSO's were completed in the first 28 days of the challenge! The breakdown of modes used by Dave was as follows: 26-CW, 11-BPSK31, 7-SSB, 5-RTTY, 1-MFSK16. As you can see, there was a definite emphasis on digital modes. The band breakdown was as follows: 3-17m, 15-20m, 8-30m, 15-40m, and 9-80m. Congratulations Dave!!


SHAD, K6CZ, DONATES FREQUENCY CHART TO PAARA FIELD DAY.

This colored chart is a graphic, single point in time portraval of the Table of Frequency Allocations used by the FCC and the NTIA. This particular chart was last printed in 2003, therefore, it does not completely reflect all aspects or recent changes to the frequency allocations.
