Don Tuite

"Ultracapacitors"

They told us in high school a 1-Farad capacitor would have to be as big as a bathtub; now they're putting ultracapacitors rated in hundreds of Farads in buses and trains and windmills. What happened? What's going on? How do ultracaps work and what are they good for? **Don Tuite, NR7X**, is a Senior Technical Editor at Electronic Design magazine. He's been working on an Electronic Design e-book sponsored by Maxwell Technologies, the biggest company in the U.S. producing ultracapacitors. At October's meeting, he will share with us what he's learned to date.

Don Tuite was first licensed in 1960, as WN2LJI. Over the years, he's been on the air as KB6UEF, KB7TB, and, since around 1985, as NR7X. He's married to **Vicky**, **N7HBJ**. Don's current on-air activity was sparked when Vicky organized a local CERT team in Emerald Hills. Don is now active in SCARES, and in addition to UHF/VHF work there, he's been developing his QRP PSK31 skills on the low bands with an ICOM 703.

President's corner



October 07

I'm sitting outside writing this feeling the sun's waning warmth. There is a slight chill in the air and the thatching of crinkled leaves tells me that it really is autumn and the equinox is at hand. On the radio, 20 meters still seems to work after sunset, but the signals have deep QSB as the ionosphere shifts from its charged state toward one where the

lower atmospheric ions are recombining and refraction is becoming more tentative and evanescent. Last month while at Mt, Shasta I did get a chance to set up and operate K6WX/P. It was amazing how quiet the bands seemed after being here in the Bay Area for so long. HF noise appeared limited to natural sources high up in the atmosphere and this allowed me to hear signals just pop up out of nowhere even with my little PAC-12 vertical antenna on the ground. It was a reminder of the irony of how our RF and computer dominated existence actually degrades overall RF performance by raising the noise floor.

I continue to get great feedback about our trip to KPH arranged by Elaine, WA6UBE. Rumor has it that a significant amount of time was taken at the last Foothills Amateur Radio Society meeting to tell everyone about the event and urge them to participate in future events. I and the board are really excited about having more of these trips and, through them, continuing to bring exciting, educational, and fun experiences to all of you.

October arriving also means that we can look forward to Pacificon, the ARRL's West Coast Ham Radio Convention sponsored by the Mt. Diablo Amateur Radio Club. Along with the usual collection of vendors and fun with our friends, there is a great lineup of talks and seminars. Friday will feature a full day of antenna talk at the Antenna Forum, followed by a full schedule of technical talks on Saturday, and the swap meet on Sunday. There will also be one day ham exam classes, a banquet, and the Wouff Hong ceremony on Saturday / Sunday at 00:00 hours. I will be giving a brand new invited talk there so stop on by. 

Porter K6URO (Ed.), Gerry Tucker N6NV, and Rick Melrose K6RDM (Membership). This group was sufficient to constitute a quorum.

Starting with old business, we first heard the President's report. **Kristen K6WX** reported that the KPH tour, organized by **Elaine Gibbons WA6UBE**, was a great success. It even received about five minutes of serious praise at the FARS meeting! We agreed that Elaine had done a wonderful service to the club and ham community. **Joel KD6W** suggested looking into the possibility of a trip to the S. S. Jeremiah O'Brien. Kristen finished her report by noting that she has been getting good feedback about our meetings.

The Board next moved on to the Secretary's report, which consisted of a vote to accept the minutes of the August meeting as published in PAARAGraphs. The Treasurer reported that the raffle is doing well, and that the club has benefited substantially from receipts from donated gear. The KPH trip has at least broken even, according to the Treasurer, and two checks that were late in being sent did finally get sent out.

Joel Wilhite (VP) reported on his efforts to line up a speaker for the December club meeting, and also that there is a strong possibility that we will have to postpone the KNTV field trip, scheduled for Sept. 29th. He also spoke about his efforts with **Doug Teeter KG6LWE** operating a booth at the flea market to make money for the club by selling donated equipment.

Next, in lieu of a report from the website committee, we collectively sent our best wishes for a speedy recovery out to the club webmaster, **Dennis Wilson KA6LSW**, who is recovering at a local hospital from an infection. **Kristen K6WX** continues to evaluate some software for membership cards. **Rick Melrose K6RDM** reported that the membership database is working smoothly and asked to revise a notice in PAARAGraphs to direct membership updates to himself, instead of the club secretary.

Joel KD6W reported on some preliminary research into the selection of a new video projector for the club, and said that he would make a specific recommendation to the board within a week. It was the sense of the board that the old projector no longer serves our needs and is ready for replacement. Someone proposed using the old projector as a raffle prize, once a new one is procured.

Moving on to new business, **Doug KD6LWE** volunteered to take a look at a tower that is available to the club as a donation. The Board next considered practices at other clubs such as token fees for members who forget their badges, etc.,

but rejected these as clashing with our being "The Friendliest Club in Town." **Joel KD6W** offered to look into badge extensions (i.e. small add-ons to badges to commemorate extra service) and report back at the next board meeting.

The nominating committee for the December 2007 elections has been partially formed: **Rob KI6INR** is chair, and **Doug KG6LWE** is a member. The third and final member is K6TBD (in other words, to be determined).

The PAARAFest (thanks, **Joel KD6W**, for hosting!) will be on October 6th. This event promises to be a lot of fun with food, beer, and equipment for sale. Joel will put together something for PAARAGraphs (maybe even with cool pictures of the gear for sale).

Wally K6URO will be reviving the gear-for-sale-or-wanted column for PAARAGraphs, so please send in any items to him. (I want to buy an IBM Selectric computer terminal if anyone has one.)

Finally, the Board discussed efforts to add narration to a great video presentation about our field day, that has been produced by **Bob Korte KD6KYT. Kristen K6WX** will transfer it to a DVD and **Gerry N6NV** will see about supplying a voice-over.

The meeting adjourned at 8:30.
