been in the Bay Area, I have never made the trip up there before. It's an impressive station, and I had the opportunity to work with some serious contesters: John, W6LD and Mike, N7MH. In addition, aside from myself, PAARA members Rebar, N6CCH and Joanna, K6YRU were there. This 5 member team ran a multi-multi operation with 5 radios. We had 2 run radios, 2 search and pounce radios, and 1 spotting radio. The operators all took turns in each position as conditions and energy dictated. In general, CONDX were marginal with 10 meters only open poorly for the first couple of hours of the contest, and it was difficult to sustain long runs, particularly on 80 meters where I operated the run radio. 40 meters had a nice run as sunset approached, however, and even 20 meters was not that great. Still, even with these deficits, we were able to score fairly well. I was told that it's difficult to win this contest from the west coast without 10 being open. It was a great experience to work with John and Mike, and I had a lot of fun working at W6YX for the first time.

Speaking of propagation, there is increasing solar activity, but as mentioned, conditions are still quite variable. The average daily solar flux index has declined over the last week, though the trend is still increasing. We've seen quite a few coronal mass ejections recently and some significant sunspots. Still, there is a long way to go before we have excellent conditions for worldwide propagation. Perhaps as we move into Spring we will see some improvement. I'm looking forward to the possibility of having significant activity on 10 meters for Field Day this year. It would really be fun if we had more operating time up there. The STEREO satellites are now giving us more solar data than ever as the two satellites are positioned such that almost the entire solar surface is visible. This is the peak of the coverage at 97%, and the satellites will move out of this condition as their orbits shift. Still, they will cover most of the sun during the remainder of their mission.

At the time I'm writing this, I'm looking forward to seeing many PAARA members at the PAARA / FARS Winter Banquet in just a few days. By the time you read this it will all be over, but I really think you will have had an enjoyable evening. An additional information note is that the PAARA meetings for February, March, and April will be held in the Council Chambers. The Burgess Recreation center is being rebuilt. In May, we should be able to meet in the newly reconstructed rec center room. Thank you all for your help and support of PAARA and we'll chat next month.

STEPHEN EMIL STUNTZ, K6FS/SK



Stephen E. Stuntz passed away at Stanford University Hospital on January 15, 2011 at the age of 97. Stuntz was born in St. Louis, Missouri on May 8, 1913, the son of Ralph Emil Stuntz, a sales engineer, and Hazel Hadden Howlett. He was the eldest of three children, and was raised in Findlay, Ohio.

After graduating from Findlay High School in 1931, Steve attended Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, for two years. He then worked in a variety of jobs and took an extended trip about the country. While in San Francisco in 1935, he enlisted in the U.S. Army. Because of his experience with amateur radio, he was assigned to duty as a signalman and posted to the Philippines. After his army service, he re-matriculated at Miami University in 1939 and completed his A.B. degree in speech in 1941, performing in theatrical productions while in college. He earned an M.A. in psychology from New York University in 1947.

On February 8, 1942, Steve married Elizabeth Madsen in Kalamazoo, Michigan. Betty and Steve both were employed in the U.S. Civil Service at Fort Custer, an Army base near Battle Creek, her home town. During World War II, he was a research associate for the Psychological Corporation, developing criteria for the selection and training of radiotelegraph operators for the U.S. Army Signal Corps and the U.S. Navy, and visiting military installations to perform psychological testing. His first daughter, Anne Margaret, was born in Chicago, March 4, 1943. His second daughter, Kathryn Andrea (Kay), was born August 26, 1945, in White Plains, New York. After brief residences at Stephens College, Columbia, Missouri, and Kent State University, Ohio, the family moved in 1949 to the vicinity of New London, Connecticut, where Steve was a research psychologist for the Navy Medical Research Laboratory and the Navy Underwater Sound Laboratory at the Naval submarine base in Groton, Connecticut, conducting research on voice communication, and measurements of communication-system effectiveness. They later lived in Sudbury, Massachusetts where he was an employee of the U.S. Air Force Decision Sciences Laboratory.

In 1964, Steve and Betty moved to California where he joined the Sensory Sciences Research Institute at Stanford Research Institute (now SRI-International). Living first in Santa Clara, they moved two years later to their long-time home in the Menalto area of Menlo Park. Betty continued her professional career teaching third grade at Laurel School, Menlo Park, retiring in 1975, preceding Steve's retirement from SRI in 1978.

Steve's secondary interests were live theater and ballet; over a period of fifteen years he and Betty subscribed to and otherwise supported Joffrey Ballet, San Francisco Ballet, Oakland Ballet, New Dance San Jose and Palo Alto Ballet. He continued his interest in communication systems, and recently was researching the history of the International Civil Aviation alphabet. Steve was a devoted ham radio operator and enjoyed talking with friends all over the world; he was honored with a life membership in the Palo Alto Amateur Radio Association (PAARA) in December 2007. He also had a life-long interest in photography and was a talented photographer.

After retirement, Betty and Steve toured the west and southwest in their camper van, visiting friends and relations in southern California, Oregon, Washington and Colorado. After his wife's death in August 2007, Steve moved to the Palo Alto Commons retirement facility, where he resided for the past two years.

Steve is survived by daughter Kay Stuntz and son-in-law Larry Carr of Highland, NY and his brother David Stuntz of Brunswick, Maine. His sister Margaret Hager died in June 2009.
