Presentation at the May meeting: A Better Way of Planning for HF Antennas — Do I want a vertical or horizontal antenna, and how high should it be? Presented by K9YC

Jim Brown, K9YC, was first licensed as WN8FNI in 1955, W8FNI a year later, and Extra in 1959. Jim was mostly inactive after college, raising a family and running his own small business. Until moving to Santa Cruz in 2006, all of his hamming has been with sim-

ple antennas on small lots and low power. Now retired to the Santa Cruz Mountains, he's been building and enjoying the station and antenna farm of his wildest dreams. This talk focuses on simple antennas for limited space, limited skyhooks, and limited budgets.

What Happened???

At age 13 I was living in Chicago. We were having a typical Chicago summer rainstorm, complete with lightning and thunder. I was not yet a ham radio operator, but I had acquired an old AM radio that had not been working, but that somehow I had been able to fix. So there it was, plugged into AC, a long-wire antenna going out the window and above the roof. With the help of that long-wire antenna, I was pulling in Chicago stations and stations all around the area. This was a relatively simple radio to operate: only an On/Off Switch/volume control and a tuning knob. Lights illuminated the tuning dial when the power was turned ON.

I had turned off the radio before going to sleep. Several hours later, I was awakened by blasts of sound coming out of the radio's speaker and the dial light was illuminated as brightly as if the radio had been turned ON. However, the power switch was *still OFF*.

I quickly correlated the spurts of sound and the flashes of the dial light with the lightning flashes. I jumped out of bed and unplugged the radio, hoping to avert some major catastrophe. The radio went quiet. In the morning, after the storm had passed, I plugged the radio back into the AC and it performed normally.

The puzzling question was: What was happening during the storm and why? What made the radio turn ON in spurts? Keep in mind that this was a vacuum-tube radio that normally needed several seconds for the filaments to warm up before any sound would come out the speaker. What was going on?

The Board Meeting was held at the Round Table Pizza Parlor in Menlo Park, commencing at 7:50 PM on the 16th of April, 2014. Attending were Kristen McIntyre K6WX (Pres), Jim Thielemann KI6KVW (Sec, Membership), Larry Rebarchik N6DB (Dir), Rob Riley KI6INR (Dir) Darryl Presley KI6LDM (Dir); and non board members, Doug Teter KG6LWE (Field Day Coordinator), Rick Melrose K6RDM (Chaplain). A quorum was present.

President's Report: Kristen, K6WX, reported that the April 4th General Meeting was well attended. The attendees enjoyed the DXpedition video to Desecheo Island. She reminded us of

the importance the 9AM TalkNet is to the club. She urged club and board member participation as the net is a great way to gain interest in ham activities and helps spread the word on PAARA's involvement.

Kristen indicated her reserve of stories is better than in the past but new stories are always needed. The board wishes to encourage the general membership to submit articles to be published in upcoming issues of PAARAgraphs. Do you have any projects, technical articles, hints n kinks, DX, on the air experiences that might be of interest? We can even help you write them up, "even if it's only 4 sentences", says Kristen.

Vice President's Report: Marty, W6NEV, though not able to attend he reminded everyone to get their order in for this year's Field Day shirt. These shirts will only be available on a preorder basis. If you plan on supporting this year's PAARA Field Day effort and want a shirt, start thinking now as there is only a short window left in which to order them. He also reported the speaker for the May meeting is K9YC, James Brown. His presentation is entitled "A better Way of Planning for HF antennas".
