# **President's Corner**

October 2015

The year is winding down already and we've just passed the equinox as I write this. CQP is upon us too, which means that I will be gone. Pacificon is just a few short weeks away too. And, of course, the

The autumnal equinox is now passed, but the day-night ratio is still well balanced. It's a great time to get on HF and take advantage of the less charged D-layer of the ionosphere. If you recall what I wrote a couple of months back, there should be less attenuation because of the

lower amount of ultraviolet radiation reaching down to the D-layer, which is closer to the earth's surface. This lower ionization level combined with the higher recombination rate of ions, as the atmosphere's density is higher closer to the surface, means that we should see less attenuation of HF signals, while still maintaining good ionization at the F1 and F2 layers. This often leads to excellent propagation, particularly around the gray-line around sunset on bands like 20m, 17m, and potentially 15m, depending on how active our sun has been. It's a good time to give some DXing a try, or try a contest and see how far you get. You might be surprised. We may not see as much E-layer refraction at this point. That tends to be most active in the summer months. How E-layer ionization patches form is not well understood, but it's always fun to catch some E-skip unexpectedly. I've been very surprised to find great singlehop propagation on 10m when it seems as though it might be dead. The whole thing is fascinating, so get out there and experience it for yourself.

# PAARA Field Day 2015 and those easy 100-point Satellite QSOs

A few months ago, I got back Into amateur radio via vhf 2m n6nfi after 2+ years of carrying but not using my radios. I saw kg6lwe Doug (PAARA Field Day Coordinator Extraordinaire) at a meeting and volunteered for Field Day 2015. Doug mentioned the club needed a satellite person because kd6w Joel would be out of the country. Thinking that it would be easy, I volunteered.

I spent the next two months studying amsat.org and other satellite sites to become an expert. Surely it would be OK with just my Arrow (2m/70cm) yagi, my HT and a tripod. Doug offered his heavy-duty tripod and I built a fixture out of PVC pipe to mount the Arrow antenna. I dug up my sailing compass for excellent pointing (azimuth). I built ½ of a large protractor for easy guessing of elevation. I thought that I had this under control.

Leading up to field day, I helped on a couple of Saturdays at Doug's to pack the trailers and build antennas, even testing the 40m 2 element beam with my own 100w Yaesu FT857D. On FD Friday, I arrived to the PAARA site at 08:45. I brought my ARES hard hat, gloves and sunblock and worked with several other hams to build antennas and towers. While moving to the upper site, I was stung by a wasp on my belly (OUCH). Thanks to the reassurance of my EPI pen (epinephrine), no trip to the ER was necessary. While leaving the site after a successful and exhausting day, I told everyone I would be at the site on Saturday just before sundown. This is where the real comedy/tragedy begins...

Early up on Saturday at 07:30 to start preparing my FM frequency by programming it in the radio for multiple satellites. Having a Mac, it turns out isn't ideal, because using the Yaesu (ADMS) software wouldn't work natively. I struggled with programming my radio (ft1dr) utilizing Fusion software (Win7 simulation). I didn't manage to download from the radio until 19:30 (12 long hours). It took looking for the proper cable (it

was in my car) and figuring out how to properly start the radio for download/upload and figuring out the drivers for my simulator and seemingly 1000s of attempts.

By 21:00 I started capturing the info, frequency pairs and names of the satellites that would pass overhead between 22:00 and 07:30 on Sunday. I tried to export a .csv of the current radio settings and then modifying it with all the satellite frequencies using 5 frequency changes for the Doppler shift of the satellites. Importing them from a .csv file failed over and over, by 00:30, I just manually put in the frequencies in the ADMS software and sent that to the radio, WooHoo!! Lastly, I started to print all the collected data and my black ink did not work. I put everything in a document and changed it all to red to print it. By 01:00, I was ready to leave; made coffee and took a shower. Off to the PAARA field day site.

Finally arrived at 01:30 and set up the tripod by the food tent and started to try and receive from the satellites with no luck. Around 03:00, k6wa Dave said that I might need to turn the squelch off. A half hour of web surfing told me how to turn it down and I had to use the monitor button to temporarily turn the squelch off. Shortly after that, I picked up a satellite with perfect reception, another WooHoo moment!! But, tragically, the massive pileup and my 5 watts didn't overwhelm before the satellite disappeared over the horizon. Shucks! (more expletives might have been said)

OK, just use the FT8900 (dual transceiver and wide-open squelch) that I just happened to have in my car, along with a 12vdc AGM battery, the power connectors and a BNC to PL259 cable adapter. I tried to get reception from remaining satellites and ISS as dawn arose over the PAARA site. I failed, but, not for a lack of trying. Around 10:00 on Sunday, I packed it up and went to help with real QSOs.

n6nv Gerry asked me to coach his Daughter Paula on GOTA (Get On The Air). She made 90+ HF QSOs on 20m in just over an hour. She

camped on ONE frequency for an hour!! Both of us felt very accomplished, hopeful for some great points for PAARA. I left after 28½ hours of being awake.

My firm rule for future Amateur Radio Satellite work, "Don't assume anything, practice, practice and even more practice!!"
