My Journey into Robotics Michael Wimble, KM6WP

Michael's talk is about his journey into the field of robotics, from an individual effort view. He will show the design of two robots he is currently working on, talk about the vast range of effort one can invest in building a robot, why he is working on robots and where I intend to go with them.

Michael retired in 2015 after a long career in computer software and hardware. He wrote operating systems and compilers and has several software patents related to debugging of large scale and complex. systems. He owned and operated three business simultaneously: Legal Data Systems—a company that used expert systems to practice law, Iowa Mountain Software—a company that wrote compilers for others, and Wimble Robotics—a company that designed and produced prototype computer systems. He also worked at Ebnek designing super computers, Apple Computer, Alta Vista—one of the first commercial search engines, Sun Microsystems and Microsoft.

The meeting was held at the home of Marty Wayne, W6NEV, commencing at 7:26 PM on September 21st, 2016. In attendance were Kristen McIntyre, K6WX (Pres), Marty Wayne, W6NEV (VP), Jim Thielemann, K6SV (Secretary/Membership), Ron Chester, W6AZ (Treasurer) [via videoconference], Larry Rebarchik, N6DB (Dir), and non-Board Member Doug Teter, KG6LWE (Field Day Coordinator). A quorum was present.

Note that for the present time and until notified otherwise, board meetings will be held at Marty's house. The board thanks Gloria and Marty for their hospitality and a much quieter environment than the Pizza Parlor.

Kristen, (K6WX), commented on a DMR QSO she had with a friend who is at MIT. She hadn't talked to him in some time making the QSO even more interesting. During the conversation she learned about the TAC channels and how to use them for 1 to 1 communications thus not tying up a large talk group channel. TAC channels have now been added to the programming in her radio. She found it quite enjoyable to carry on the QSO using DMR over long distances.

Kristen requested we all put on our thinking caps to come up with some new raffle prize ideas for the monthly meetings. What would you like to win in the raffle, no a GT350R doesn't qualify? If you have any ideas, let a member of the board know or Jim Rice, K6AK, raffle coordinator. The board also had a short conversation regarding the upcoming Dream to Reality raffle in December. No decision was made on what the grand prize will be.

Kristen reminded the board that it's election time. She's yet to identify an election chair. The board suggested a couple of candidates who she's going to talk to. The election chair will be announced at the October meeting. Now is the time to indicate your interest in a

board or director position in your club. There are 3 director seats up for election along with all 4 board positions. Election nominations close at the end of the November meeting.

Kristen also mentioned that her reserve of stories is getting thin again thus is on the lookout for more stories. If you have committed to a story but not submitted it (there are several people out there fitting this category) please put pen to paper or fingers on the keyboard and let your creative juices flow! Do you have any projects, Field Day experiences, technical articles, hints n kinks, DX contacts, or experiences setting up your station or antenna, on the air experiences that might be of interest? Vice President's Report: Marty, W6NEV, announced that Mike Wimble, KM6WP will be talking about "His Journey into the field of Robots" at the October meeting. Marty also announced having lined up speakers through the end of the year. As always, if you know of someone who would be of interest to the club, let Marty know. Marty also commented on his current efforts at identifying the next PAARA field trip. Let Marty know if you have any ideas for the next trip.

Secretary's report: Jim, K6SV, reported that there are currently 191 PAARA members, the most since he's been keeping track. Last year at this time there were only 170 members! What a wonderful increase to the membership. He also reported that there were 5 new members joining in September. Additionally, he reported that the club has 3.1% of the membership who aren't licensed, 46.2% of the members hold a technician or general license and 50.7% of the members hold advanced or amateur extra licenses.

Treasurer's Report: Ron, W6AZ, informed the board of the proceeds from the last month was on par for this time of year. Of note was the \$2,000 in sales Joel, KD6W, made over the previous two months from flea market sales and the D-Star sale.

Under Old Business:

The topic of ASVARO and the Flea Market was discussed again. There were a wide range of items discussed but boiled down to this year being the least profitable Flea Market for PAARA ever. The board discussed needing to identify an individual that will spearhead a query on behalf of all the clubs involved with the flea market to identify ways of improving the event. Several names were discussed as possible candidates. Kristen will be reaching out to them.

The inventory of PAARA "stuff" which is located at various members QTH's is continuing topic. As no one really has a handle on exactly what "stuff" there is, where it is or what condition it might be in. This topic is still a work in process.

Under New Business:

Jim, K6SV, mentioned taking a look at the cost of PAARAgraphs. The current printing cost is \$1.35. Adding in the 0.47 postage brings the per issue cost to \$1.82. This means the total per member cost for 1 year's worth of PAARAgraphs is \$21.84. The board discussed the possibility of raising the dues and looked at what other clubs are charging. Most all of the other clubs don't mail out a newsletter any longer and with the exception of 1 club we looked at have higher dues and in 1 case way higher dues than PAARA. At this moment, the dues are going to remain at \$20/member however that could change in the New Year. So you might want to consider renewing your membership for 2017 early.

Kristen confirmed the next PAARAplink is

scheduled for October 30th. It's more than likely that it will be the last one due to the gun law changes that go into effect in January. If you ever wanted to be part of this event, plan to attend now or miss out.

Jim, K6SV, reminded the board of a topic that was postponed from the last meeting. The topic revolved around the circumstances surrounding any item that might require a board vote before the next scheduled board meeting. This type of thing doesn't happen often but has happened in the recent past. The board members present agreed that in order to have a vote by email, the reason for the vote had to be one which the majority of board members agreed couldn't wait until the next board meeting. If a vote was required, it would be conducted as a roll call vote to eliminate the possibility of a member having an opinion on the item and for whatever reason not being part of or seeing the email chain regarding the item being voted on. It was further agreed that the regular board mailing list wouldn't be used for voting as there are numerous people on the list that don't have voting privileges. As always, any email vote would be documented in the next secretary's report.

The Board meeting was adjourned at 9:09 PM.






