Transceiver Performance for the **HF - DX Operator**

How good is your receiver in todays operating environment? What should I look for when researching a new receiver or transceiver? Rob will give us some performance items to consider when looking for a replacement receiver or transceiver for our shack.

Bio

Ham radio began for me in 1961 in Cincinnati, Ohio, as both a novice and general-class operator. After graduating college in 1969 with a degree in physics, I moved to Denver and worked for KOA radio as an engineer until 1987. While at KOA. I maintained their 50 KW AM and FM transmitters, microwave links and studio equipment.

1974 saw the beginning of Sherwood Engineering, offering roofing filters and upgrade kits for the Drake R-4C. In 1976 I started measuring receiver performance on dozens of radios. since reviews in QST did not correlate with actual on-air observations at crunch time in CW In 1977 "ham radio magazine" contests. published the first of several of my articles on receiver problems and cures, vertical antenna ground systems and mobile antenna efficiency. Those articles are available on my web site as PDF files. Receiver test data is now web based with over 100 transceivers included at www.nc0b.com/table.html.

PAARA CALL SIGN HISTORY

PAARA has four club call signs; W6ARA, W6OTX, K6YQT, and K6OTA. PAARA has used several calls as club calls over the years. The most frequently used calls were W6ARA (of course), W6OTX, K6OTA, K6YQT. For Field Day, PAARA also use individual hams calls occasionally and, once N6NFI was used.

For this article, I will focus on W6ARA. You will recognize W6ARA as our club call. It is the call sign used by PAARA for club outings such as Field Day. Where did W6ARA come from and how did PAARA get the call? My curiosity was piqued and I began researching the history of W6ARA.

The easy part was finding the mundane info like when the call first issued, who held the license grants, and for how long. This was easy because of the web site, www.archive.org, my main source for this data. This source has most Amateur Radio Callbooks from 1913 thru 1997. There are some other resources such as the FCC database, www.silentkeyhq.com, and others but these also only give statistical data. What's missing is who, what, and how W6ARA was issued to PAARA.

I received input from, Gerry Tucker, N6NV, Ron Chester, W6AZ, and Chuck Johnson, N6VFH. I've researched PAARAgraphs and along with info from those listed above, learned how W6ARA, the call PAARA now use, was determined. Let's see what has been found so far.

NOTE: The dates given below are the publish dates of the Radio Amateur Callbooks. Because of the delay getting information from the FCC grant issue date to the Radio Amateur Callbook publisher, the actual grant and cancellation dates are about one year earlier than the callbook date.

W6ARA

Per the Amateur Radio Callbooks, the 6ARA license grant was first issued to G. F. Zobel in San Francisco CA in 1921. At that time, calls

with letter prefixes weren't used therefore, the license was issued as 6ARA. The 1922 callbook still shows the same G. F. Zobel. In 1923 thru 1926, the name changed to Jerome F. Zobel, in San Francisco but still as 6ARA In 1927, under new FCC rules and regulations, the W prefix was added. Now W6ARA, the call was held by Jerome F. Zobel until 1929.

W6ARA doesn't appear in the 1930 callbook. In 1931, the license grant was issued to Robert S. Baldwin of San Francisco CA. He held the call until 1951. Note: there were no Radio Amateur Callbooks published during the war years 1942 through 1945 but because Robert S. Baldwin still had the call in 1946, it's can be assumed he held that call throughout that time. From 1952 thru 1964, there was no callbook listing of W6ARA. In 1965 the license grant was issued to Stanley L. Greissman of Sacramento CA. He held W6ARA until the Spring of 1968. The call again disappears from the callbooks from 1969 through 1977. Then, in 1978, the license was granted to Jerome F. Zobel, Palo Alto CA (second time around) and was in his name until 1997. The callbooks from 1998 through today aren't in the archives so the grant may (and per a Gerry Tucker, N6NV article in the February, 2006 issue of PAARAgraphs) did extended until 2005.

Jerome Zobel was a PAARA member for a number of years. He passed away in 1999. According to Ron Chestier, W6AZ, club call was requested from the FCC. With a bit of serendipity and excellent timing, on January 10, 2006, W6ARA call was assigned to PAARA and voila, the rest is history.

The call (W)6ARA has had a long and varied history in amateur radio. If you look at January, 2006 PAARAgraphs letterhead, only W6OTX, K6OTA, and K6YQT are listed. On the February, 2006 letterhead, W6ARA, W6OTX, K6OTA, and K6YQT are listed.

over the years including Dayton, Visalia, Cosy Wyoming HamCon, Duke City Hamfest, and many others.

Thirteen years ago, my XYL encouraged me to build my dream contest station on 10 acres east of Ft. Collins, Colorado on the Pawnee Grassland. This has made it possible to evaluate top transceivers in major contests in a real-world environment to augment my laboratory data. This rural setting has allowed me to focus my interest on effective antennas. Six towers support 9 mono-band HF yagi antennas, plus 6 and 2 meters, and several wire antennas on 160, 40 and 30 meters. A 70cm yagi was added in the fall of 2019.

My most recent new project has been making contacts on the new 630m band with a transverter from Australia. An IC-7300 on 160 meters handles receiver and transmit on 630m. I use my 160-meter Marconi T antenna with a separate tuner.

Cubberley Community Center Status

A recent email from the City of Palo Alto confirms that Cubberley Community Center will be closed through the end of August; therefore, the August meeting will be held on-line. Though a bit more like a state QSO party, it's a fun one to work by trying to collecting all the colonies.

Even with the Covid-19 situation and most all DXpiditions canceled, there's plenty of DX to keep you interested. Most days see lots of activity on 50 Mhz across Europe and the US and occasionally between the two. 10 M has even opened up on occasion also in Europe and the US as well to other destinations around the globe. Interestingly, a lot of the contacts have shifted from SSB to digital. If you haven't tried one of the digital modes, you should as you can make contacts using a digital mode that aren't possible otherwise, unless you're a CW guy which I'm not. Though many refer FT8 as a "point and cluck robot mode", I still have lots of enjoyment making contacts to DX entities that I haven't even heard on SSB before! Even with a modest station, you can still make contacts in less than optimum band conditions.

Hopefully, everyone noticed the nouncement of the 1st on-line Virtual Ham Radio Expo which will be August 8th & 9th. This is a free event so there's no cost to you but your time. If you didn't notice it, vou can still signup www.gsotodayhamexpo.com. There are around 70 presentations most by people we don't normally see or hear. Our "own" Joel, KD6W, will be presenting on "Digital Amateur Television and Social Distancing". As there's a wide range of topics, there must be something of interest to everyone. The best part is the ability to watch a presentation after the fact. So if there are two interesting topics at the

same time, you can view one live, the other at another time, up to 30 days after the event. Vendors will also have a presentation area. I'm not sure how that will work but I know we'll find out shortly.

On 7/19, our repeaters were finally put onto a large UPS. Joel, KD6W, salved an almost new ADC UPS with more than enough capacity to back up the repeaters for many hours should the power fail. This upgrade has been in the works for quite some time but finding the best solution to meet requirements has been elusive. The next step is to get the 900MHz repeater on the air. The project is underway and getting closer to completion.

In the process of drafting this letter, I received an email advising me that Gerry, N6NV, Rebar, N6DB, and Doug KG6L-WE, went to the site to work on getting the 900MHz antenna installed along with the feed line. Seems that upon arrival, they found the whole area had "turned" pink! There was a fire near the repeater that came within a few thousand feet of the site. Thanks to the hard work of fire-

fighters, the flames were abated by on the ground forces and through the use of air-dropped fire retardant turning the tower, antennas, shack, and trees pink. Having them pink is much better than the fire engulfing the area! The good news, thanks to their hard work, the 900MHz repeater is getting closer to being on the air.






